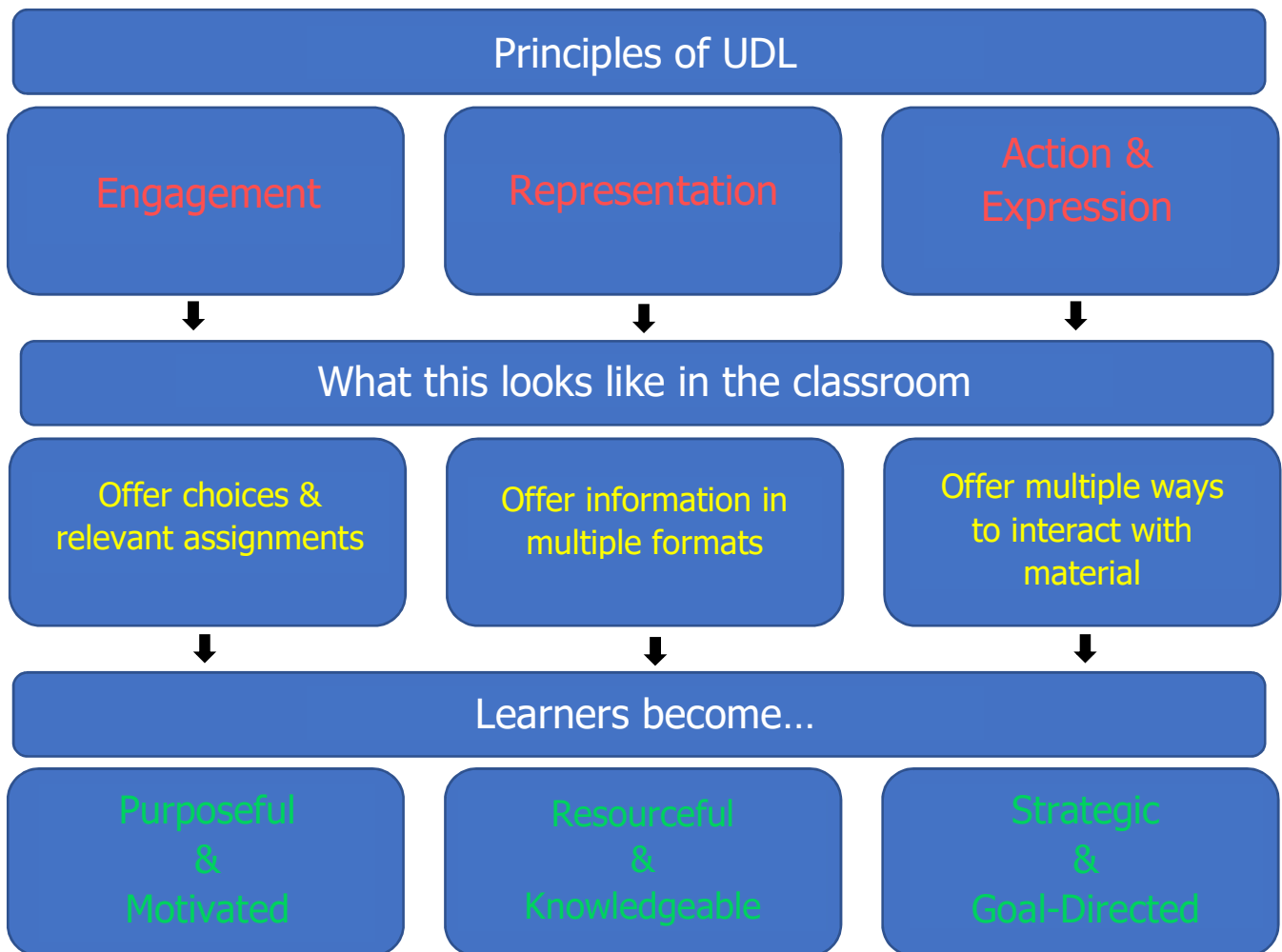


Wouldn't it be wonderful if we found a way to reach all students and helped them become expert learners?

Universal Design for Learning

Using the Universal Design for Learning framework to design our instruction will allow us to reach all of our students from the beginning of a lesson. This is not Differentiation, we are not modifying parts of lessons already created, we are designing lessons that reach all learners by offering options. Rather than designing instruction for the average, we are designing instruction to the edges to reach each learner. (Rose, 2013)
